Objects of Constitution

The Church Building

For the benefit of the public to maintain, repair, restore, preserve, improve and enhance the fabric of the church of St Mary and All Saints, Droxford, in the Diocese of Portsmouth, its monuments, fixtures, fittings, furniture, stained glass, ornaments and other chattels in its churchyard.

The Heritage of Droxford and The Church

To advance the education of the public in the heritage of the church and the local area by providing information on its history and architecture.

The Community Hub

To promote activities for the benefit of the inhabitants of Droxford Parish and its neighbouring districts without distinction of age, sex, race, political, religious or other opinion, by associating the statutory authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities or activities in the interest of social welfare, for recreation or other leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants.

OUR AIMS

1. Events and Activities

We aim to satisfy our Objects by engaging with the village community so that more people and a wider range of people use the church building. We will do this by facilitating, encouraging, promoting, supporting and organising events and activities which are appropriate to the spaces available in the church and churchyard, which complement other spaces in the village, and which are consistent with our Objects.
